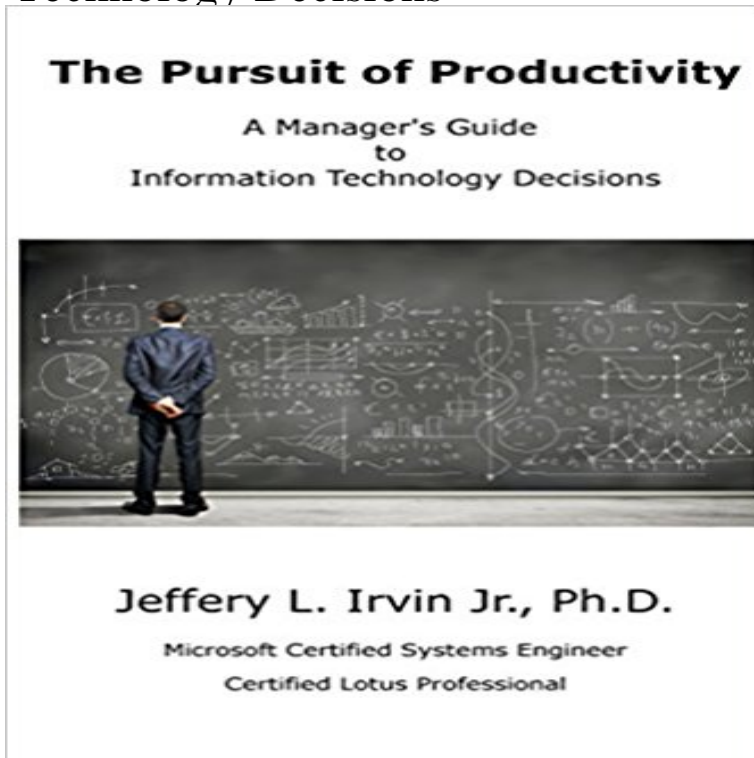


The Pursuit of Productivity: A Managers Guide to Information Technology Decisions
